SPARKING A CHANGE IN LOCAL MENTAL HEALTH

At the beginning of 2022, Mile Bluff Medical Center
Foundation was awarded a two-year grant from the Roots &
Wings Foundation. The funds were to be used to support a
strong start for kids, strong minds, and strong communities.
After meeting with several community members, it was
determined that these funds should address mental health in
our community. Focusing on children and the community as a
whole, the foundation used the grant to provide:

- » \$75,000 to local schools School districts in Mauston, Elroy, Necedah, New Lisbon, and Wisconsin Dells received \$15,000 each to support mental health programming for their students and staff. The foundation is looking to provide support to other schools in 2023.
- » FREE Mental Health First Aid Trainings Mental Health First Aid is a one-day course that prepares attendees to interact with a person experiencing a mental health crisis. The foundation has offered training sessions that prepare attendees to interact with teens, adults, and older adults.
 - Since October 2022, over 80 people have attended these sessions and more are scheduled into 2023.
- » Spark In the Park On Saturday, October 22 the foundation invited the community to "Spark In The Park." The purpose of this event was to spark a conversation, spark a connection, and spark a change in mental health. Over 120 attendees were encouraged to connect with local mental health service providers and community resources, to discover a new form of selfcare, and spark a change in their mental health.
- » Books for the Emergency Department Using grant funds, the foundation worked with Scholastic and the Friends of Hatch Public Library to supply books for Mile Bluff's Emergency Department (ED). Books are given to children who are in the ED, not only to support literacy development, but to also provide distraction. The books will relieve anxiety, stress, and fear for the young patients.

IMPACTING CARE AT MILE BLUFF

Randy Brandt is a physician assistant at Mile Bluff Clinic. In addition to supporting the community by providing primary care services, Randy also is a supporter of Mile Bluff Medical Center Foundation.

These funds will be used to purchase equipment that enhances the patient care experience in these newly-remodeled areas.

This procedure table keeps patients comfortable as clinical staff perform procedures in the clinic setting.

TRACTION TABLE - \$8,091 (top photo)

Awarded to: Rehabilitation Department

A traction table allows therapists to provide cervical and lumbar traction to patients to treat and relieve neck and back pain.

BARIATRIC LAB DRAW CHAIR - \$3,929

Awarded to: Necedah Family Medical Center
This chair will increase nations comfort and prov

This chair will increase patient comfort and provide better ergonomics for staff as blood samples are collected.

EXAM TABLES (2) - \$3,764

Awarded to: Mile Bluff Clinic

These exam tables keep patients comfortable, while allowing clinic staff to provide safe and efficient care.

TYMPANOMETER - \$3,380 (middle photo)

Awarded to: Elroy Family Medical Center

A tympanometer is used to measure the health of a patient's eardrum. This will allow the medical staff to do early assessments of ear health on site, decreasing the need for patients to travel.

THEATER EQUIPMENT - \$1,100

Awarded to: Fair View Nursing & Rehabilitation Center With a projector and retractable screen, a theater room will be created for nursing home residents.

TUMBLE FORMS FEEDER SEAT - \$475

Awarded to: Speech Department

The Tumble Forms Feeder Seat will be used to position infants when they are having a modified barium swallow study.

TRAINING BONES - \$324 (bottom photo)

Awarded Department: Education Department

These training bones are used to simulate use of intraosseous access for emergency patient care.
