# FOR YOU. WITH YOU. A CAPITAL CAMPAIGN.

In 2024, Mile Bluff Medical Center began a twophased remodeling project. Phase one focused on turning the former Mauston Shopko building into the Gateway Center - a new home for Mile Bluff Pharmacy, the dialysis department and Urgent Care. The second phase of the project will focus on remodeling the existing Emergency Department.

To support this expansion project, Mile Bluff Medical Center Foundation is leading a capital fundraising campaign - For You. With You. - with the goal of raising \$5 million to help offset the costs of this \$17 million investment.

In 2024, donors were very generous, and between gifts, pledges and grants, donors gave over \$2.43 million toward this cause. The Gateway Center opened in March 2025, and construction in the emergency department will begin in the summer of 2025. Fundraising efforts will continue throughout the coming year.

# **COMMUNITY SUPPORT**

At the beginning of 2024, Mile Bluff Medical Center Foundation was awarded a two-year grant from the Roots & Wings Foundation. The funds were to be used to support patients in the prenatal to age 3 range. Using this grant, Mile Bluff has been able to provide:

**SLEEP SACKS:** Infant sleeping bags — also known as sleep sacks — are wearable blankets designed to keep babies warm and also reduce the risk of SIDS. Every Mile Bluff newborn receives a sleep sack to take home from the birth center.

**SAFE SITTER CLASSES**: This course is designed to prepare students in sixth through eighth grade to be safe when they are home alone, watching



younger siblings, or babysitting.
Lessons are filled with fun activities and role-playing exercises that teach students injury prevention and

treatment, CPR, management of problem behaviors and the business side of babysitting.

NOSE FRIDA & DIGITAL THERMOMETERS: In our rural communities, parents sometimes struggle to access baby care supplies, even simple items like nasal aspirators and thermometers. Primary care providers identified that these items would

aid parents when their newborns are ill. Grant funds were used to purchase these items for clinic patients.

JAUNDICE METERS: Three jaundice meters were purchased for the clinics in Lake Delton, New Lisbon, and Necedah. This device checks the bilirubin levels of newborn babies.

**BLOOD PRESSURE MONITORS:** During pregnancy and after delivery, mothers who are at risk for

developing hypertensive disorders, like preeclampsia, require routine monitoring of their blood pressure.

To reduce the risk of complications for both mother and baby, at home blood pressure monitoring



is essential. Using grant funds, blood pressure monitors were purchased to distribute to patients who were at high risk for hypertensive disorders during pregnancy. Using the monitors, mothers track their blood pressure at home and alert their providers if there is any change.

# Medication Aide Certification Program \$2,310

A medication aide certification program teaches students how to safely administer medications to patients. Using scholarship funds, the foundation supported the registration and program costs so three of Mile Bluff's certified nursing assistants could attend.

# **APPROVED EQUIPMENT REQUESTS**

Through the generosity of donors, Mile Bluff Medical Center Foundation was able to approve \$16,952 in equipment requests in 2024.

# **BOVIE LED PROCEDURE LIGHT - \$4,772**

Awarded to: Elroy Family Medical Center

This light will be used during in-clinic procedures. Whatever the procedure, this lamp is easier for staff to maneuver, which leaves caregivers with more time for addressing the patient's needs.

# EZ WAY MECHANICAL LIFT - \$4,493

Awarded to: Crest View Nursing & Rehabilitation Center

This lift will be used at Crest View to transfer residents from different surfaces such as the bed, chair, toilet and floor. It improves safety for residents and staff alike.

# **AV500 VEIN VIEWER - \$4,129**

Awarded to: Infusion & Wound Care Department

Used on a daily basis, the vein viewer is a tool that supports successful IV starts in minimal attempts by allowing nurses to view veins and vein valves when starting an IV.

# VITALS CART - \$1,606

Awarded to: Rehabilitation Services at Fair View Nursing & Rehabilitation Center

Physical Therapy and Occupational Therapy staff caring for residents at Fair View, will use the vitals cart with residents prior to starting a therapy session. The cart would also be readily accessible if a resident starts to experience an emergency event.

# 2 - IBREEZE BPAP SYSTEM - \$1,482

Awarded to: Respiratory Therapy

The iBreeze BPAP system is a bedside unit that delivers positive airway pressure therapy for the treatment of obstructive sleep apnea and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease. During hospital stays, these machines will be used on patients that have already been diagnosed and use this type of device at home.

# **DIGITAL PEDIATRIC SCALE - \$470**

Awarded to: Mile Bluff Clinic

This digital scale will be used for pediatric patients. It will make the rooming process for young patients easier and will ensure weights for children are accurate.
