SUPPORTING 3D MAMMOGRAPHY AT MILE BLUFF

This summer, Mile Bluff Medical Center Foundation partnered with the medical center to bring 3D mammography to the community.

Mammography is an important tool for detecting breast cancer at its earliest stage. Studies show that 3D mammography can improve detection of breast cancer in women of all ages, provide clearer images regardless of breast tissue density, and increase early detection of smaller, more invasive cancers. Early detection is critical in the fight against breast cancer.

The cost of 3D mammography equipment is around \$450,000. Projects of this magnitude are made easier when supported by donors who believe in the mission of providing exceptional healthcare at the local level.

A goal was set to raise \$100,000 to offset the costs of the new equipment. While the goal was not fully met, the foundation is pleased to announce that \$61,164 was collected to support the cause.

Whether it was a generous donation from a business or individual, or funds raised from a high school volleyball 'pink night,' or the Bras for A Cause initiative, the support of the community was amazing.

The new 3D mammogram machine was up and running by mid-January 2020. Not only is this new equipment better at detecting cancer, it has special patient experience features and has the capabilities to perform new diagnostic services.

Special features of the Senographe Pristina by GE include:

- Pristina Dueta is a patient-assisted compression device that gives you control during your mammogram.
- Curved and padded armrests promote relaxation and decrease muscle tension.
- SensorySuite uses sights, scents and sounds to draw your attention away from the mammogram itself, making it a more pleasant experience.
- Stereotactic biopsies can be performed if a suspicious area is found, taking a sample of breast tissue to be tested for cancer cells.





Awarded Department: Surgery

This equipment allows for extremely accurate shoulder/arm positioning during orthopedic surgery. The positioner also helps reduce discomfort and promotes a quicker recovery in patients.

Medical cart workstations (2)

\$7,525

Awarded Department: Fair View

Workstations allow nursing staff members to transport their computers throughout the facility. These carts are for charting within resident rooms, and will aid in simple medication distribution.

Isotour turn-assist mattress and pump \$7,500

Awarded Department: Medical/Surgical

At times, there are patients in the inpatient setting who have a hard time turning in bed. This specialized mattress will help staff members to safely turn those patients, which will help to reduce the risk of pressure injuries.

Kwalu Valentia Gliders (3)

\$6,586

Awarded Department: Obstetrics

Patients requested new rockers for the OB suites.
These new gliders are ideal for breastfeeding, and provide mothers with a comfortable spot to bond with baby.

Accuvein illuminator & stand

\$6,120

Awarded Department: Medical Imaging

The illuminator will assist in finding the veins of medical imaging patients. The more IV attempts a patient undergoes (whether successful or unsuccessful) the higher the risk for developing scar tissue, which also eventually makes IV starts more difficult overall.

Noelle OB simulator

\$4,300

Awarded Department: Education

This automated manikin is used to simulate delivery and emergency situations during childbirth. Mile Bluff nurses and doctors, local EMTs, and other healthcare providers will utilize this equipment.

Awarded Department: Infusion & Cancer Care

For patients undergoing infusion or chemotherapy treatment, this recliner will provide a comfortable place to receive care.

RealCare geriatric simulator

\$3,555

Awarded Department: Education

This simulator is a wearable age suit that staff can use to experience a variety of age-related physical challenges.

Kwalu Valdina easy-access chair

\$3,400

Awarded Department: Medical/Surgical

Hip replacement patients will use this chair when in the inpatient setting. The chair allows them to sit without bending at the hip.

Scale \$1,751

Awarded Department: Infusion & Cancer Care

Accurate and updated weights are an important part of an appropriate assessment for infusion and chemotherapy patients. This scale will help provide staff members with the equipment they need, when they need it, to follow best practices to care for patients in the department.

Huntleigh super doppler

\$1,469

Awarded Department: Fair View

This handheld doppler machine allows for earlier and more sensitive detection of complications related to diabetes/vascular issues, blood clots, and decreased circulation.

Seca 769 digital Scale

Awarded Department: Obstetrics

This scale will be dedicated solely for use in the OB Department. It will help the staff keep up-to-date on best practices for new moms.
