# **COMMITMENT, RESILIENCE & HOPE**

Those are the words that come most to mind for 2021. Mile Bluff's commitment to the health and safety of those we serve is stronger than ever.

As a rural hospital we had to adapt quickly to changing environments throughout the year. The pandemic may have changed the way we live our daily lives, but it has not changed the powerful role rural hospitals play in the healthcare of our community. We are resilient.

We kicked off 2021 by setting up a vaccine clinic at Mile Bluff's new building site on Kennedy Street in Mauston. In a five-month period, staff administered 10,245 injections and gave so many in our community hope that this pandemic could and would end. Bringing this and so many other services to our area, community members have really seen the benefits of having a rural hospital close to home.

This past November, Mile Bluff saw an increase in hospitalized patients with COVID-19. We averaged five to eight hospitalized COVID-positive patients daily, and were at or near capacity due to other admitted patients and tight staffing. Compounding this, larger urban hospitals were also at capacity and unable to take patients that may have been transferred from Mile Bluff. But through all of this, the Mile Bluff team stepped up, yet again. We were able to treat many COVID patients close to home, helping ease the burden on patients and their families.

We were called to care for the sick and dying, even when we were running short of space or the personnel to do so. To be creative and resourceful in the face of shortages. And with your help – Mile Bluff did. Every

individual, every family has experienced challenges, and yet the community has reached out to support the medical center with financial gifts that eased the difficulties of fighting the pandemic.

Every donation, every kind word, every encouragement counts and bolsters our commitment, resilience and hope.

Thank you for making a difference to the patients and families we serve every day. And to us. Your philanthropy has made a significant impact on the level of care we have been able to provide during these difficult and constantly changing times. As you review this report, please accept my heartfelt thanks for making these things possible.


### **BUILDING BRIDGES TO HEALTHCARE**

No one should have to make a choice between getting healthcare services and putting food on the table. Yet, many people have to make that choice. Recently, a grant from the Roots & Wings Foundation has helped Mile Bluff increase access to medical care for those who are underinsured, uninsured, or who are on Medicare and Medicaid.

The funds support patient financial advocates who help area residents find and navigate a sustainable financial pathway to healthcare. This could mean helping patients find an appropriate health plan on the Marketplace, or connecting them with financial resources to pay medical bills. One of Mile Bluff's Financial Advocate said, "When I can guide someone, it makes my job so rewarding. It makes my heart smile to know that I am able to help people who, through no fault of their own, fall through the cracks in the system. Everyone deserves to be cared for."

# **EQUIPMENT PURCHASES**

### DRAEGER JAUNDICE METER (2) - \$14,105

**Awarded to:** Elroy Family Medical Center & Mile Bluff's Obstetrics Department

A jaundice screening meter checks newborns for elevated levels of bilirubin without having babies undergo blood tests.

### PEDIATRIC CRIB - \$10,716

Awarded to: Med/Surg Department

When infants and pediatric patients require hospital or surgical care, a pediatric crib is often used. This new model incorporates a scale and has doors near each corner of the crib for easy access to a young patient.

### KANGAROO CHAIRS (2) - \$8,471

Awarded to: Infusion & Cancer Care Department

For patients undergoing infusion or chemotherapy treatment, these recliners provide the type of support and comfort needed by a patient receiving long treatments.

### PORTA SCAN 3D BLADDER SCANNER - \$8,428

Awarded to: Crest View Nursing & Rehabilitation Center

The scanner assesses bladder volume and helps decrease the occurrence of bladder and urinary tract infections in nursing home residents

### MATRIX TREADMILLS (2) - \$8,092

Awarded to: Health Promotion Department

Treadmills are the most requested piece of equipment in cardiac and pulmonary rehabilitation. These replacement treadmills are state-of-the-art and even have WI-FI connectivity.

### BREWER EXAM TABLES (4) - \$7,628

Awarded to: Mile Bluff Clinic

These exam tables keep patients comfortable while allowing clinic staff to provide safe and efficient care.

### ABPI MD KIT & CUFF - \$4,500

Awarded to: Infusion & Cancer Care Department

Compression therapy is often used during wound care. This kit helps determine the appropriate level of compression, while insuring there is good blood flow throughout the patient's body.

### PRIME TC TRANSPORT CHAIR - \$3,303

Awarded to: Med/Surg Department & Cancer Care

This unique transport chair is designed for patient comfort. It's also ergonomic and helps prevent back and muscle injuries experienced by healthcare staff transporting patients.

### MCGRATH MAC VIDEO LARYNGOSCOPES (2)- \$2,250

Awarded to: Emergency Department

This scope combines direct and video laryngoscopy into a single device designed to handle the unique challenges of airway management. This versatile tool allows staff to place a breathing tube more efficiently in an emergency situation.

### HIGH CHAIR - \$239

Awarded to: Speech Therapy

When pediatrics patients are being seen for swallowing/ feeding issues, this highchair will provide an appropriate setting for feeding evaluations and treatment sessions.

### **KAUFMAN SPEECH PRAXIS TREATMENT KIT - \$218**

Awarded to: Speech Therapy

This is a systematic treatment program that teaches children to simplify word pronunciation patterns, making it easier for them to communicate.

### MAMMOGRAPHY CAPES, \$133

Awarded to: Medical Imaging Department

Mammography capes are easy for the technicians to work with and allow for a modest patient experience rather than having to work with a regular hospital gown during the screening.
