Phase II of the healing garden project is underway. In the coming year, we shift our focus to the garden in the surgical wing. 

APPROVED EQUIPMENT PURCHASES

Ferromagnetic Detection System

\$21,355

This system is used in the Medical Imaging Department to screen patients for metal prior to receiving an MRI.

MegaCode Kelly

\$12,964

MegaCode Kelly is a training manikin that helps the Education Department provide learners with more realistic situations (breathing sounds, heart sounds, pulse, etc.). This manikin helps staff improve life-saving skills and care that directly impacts patients.

Children's Activity Wall/Centers

\$9,149

To improve the experience of Mile Bluff's youngest patients, interactive activity wall/centers were installed in all Mile Bluff outreach facilities, medical imaging and surgery departments.

Accuvein Illuminator and Stand

\$6,989

The illuminator assists the Infusion & Cancer Care Department in finding the veins of infusion and chemotherapy patients.

Midmark 647 Podiatry Chair

\$6,509

This treatment chair is being used in Mile Bluff's Wound Care Clinic. This chair not only makes treatment more comfortable for older individuals and those with various health conditions, but it also helps the staff to provide care in an even more ergonomic and safer manner.

2 Nara Bassinets

\$6,446

Nara bassinets are designed to allow babies to be closer to their mothers when they're in bed. The height of the bassinet is adjustable, giving moms easier access to their babies following delivery in Mile Bluff's Obstetrics Department.

2 Premier Broselow Pediatric Carts

\$6.063

This cart is designed to aid in rapid response to pediatric patients needing intubation in an emergency situation. These carts are being used in the Emergency Department and the Obstetrics Department.

2 Body Mechanics Wheelchairs

\$6,000

These ergonomically-correct chairs are designed to prevent back and muscle injury related to transporting patients. The wheelchairs are used specifically to transfer patients between ER, Medical Imaging and Respiratory Therapy.

Mini Telemetry System

\$5,899

This wireless system allows mothers in labor to walk freely in their rooms or hallways while being monitored for contractions and fetal heart tones.

2 Bariatric Scales

\$5,880

This scale provides extra support rails for anyone who has trouble standing without assistance.

These scales are being used at the clinics in Elroy and Necedah.

L8 18i Hockey Stick Ultrasound Probe \$5,760

This tool allows for medical imaging testing to be conducted in small areas of the body. It can be used for various tests, interventional procedures, biopsies and scans.

Low Access Power Exam Table

\$4,942

This table can be lowered close to the ground, making it easier and safer for our elderly and disabled patients at Mile Bluff Clinic.

Sci-Fit PRO 2 Total Body Exerciser

Sci-Fit PRO 2 Total Body Exerciser

\$4,916

This machine is used to improve heart and lung health in patients undergoing cardiac or pulmonary rehabilitation.

Pocket Panic Buttons

\$3,597

These panic buttons will be carried by care staff at the main medical center campus in Mauston.

Blanket Warming Cabinet

\$3,450

A warm blanket provides comfort and reduces anxiety for patients who are undergoing tests and treatments in the Medical Imaging Department.

Surgery IV Warmer

\$3,157

Warming IV fluids before they are given to a patient undergoing surgery improves patient outcomes.

2 Standard Titan Draw Carts

\$3.115

These carts help to improve infection control as lab staff transports needed supplies to patient rooms when collecting blood.

Bubble CPAP System

\$2,713

Respiratory Therapy uses this to provide continuous positive airway pressure when a newborn baby has labored breathing or low oxygen levels.

2 Charging Stations

\$1,240

Patients and visitors can charge their devices when their own chargers are not available.

GKmini Walking Surface

\$1,002

This moving surface helps rehabilitation patients relearn to walk after a stroke or spinal cord injury.

Clinton Training Stairs

\$1,187

This small adjustable staircase is used in the inpatient setting for patients who need to practice and/or learn how to go up and down stairs in a safe way, prior to discharge.

Air and Oxygen Blender

\$1,126

To help patients who are having breathing issues, Respiratory Therapy uses this equipment to make sure the right blend of oxygen is being delivered.

Two iPads

\$900

iPads will be used by our speech pathologists to provide education, direct visual/audio feedback, and provide therapeutic exercises/tasks.

Sensory Equipment for Dementia Care

\$735

This equipment helps decrease agitation, reduce restlessness, and even improve sleep in residents with dementia.

2 Arterial Core Thermometers

\$715

These thermometers scan a patient's forehead to provide immediate results. These are especially nice for infants and toddlers at Mile Bluff Clinic.

Audiology Software

\$350

An Auditory Steady State Response test can help assess hearing in people who cannot voluntarily respond to pure tones. The software is used for infants and young children, children with special needs, and individuals with worker's compensation cases.

iPad \$300

The tablet will be used for patient education and information collection in the Social Services Department. The larger screen will be ideal for patients with vision issues.

Buzzy \$198

Buzzy is used to block pain during needle stick procedures. Buzzy uses a combination of cold and vibration to dull pain receptors. This is being used in the Medical Imaging Department.
